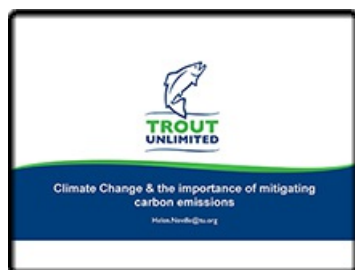
Climate Change and Trout
